Welcome to the July news bulletin from Brixton Parish Council (BPC).

The Parish Council cannot meet remotely due to the expiry of remote legislation on 7th May 2021 so face to face monthly Parish Council meetings have resumed in the Community Room adjacent to the school. The location of our meetings is constantly reviewed as we are mindful of the safety of parishioners and councillors alike. All working group meetings are continuing via zoom.

BPC is continually pressing our local MP and Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to allow councils the flexibility to hold meetings remotely when they deem appropriate.

BPC is looking into the possibility of holding hybrid meetings and will let you know if this comes to fruition.

Brixton Parish Council has a Business Continuity Plan. This can be viewed on www.brixonparishcouncil.org.uk along with the councils other policies.

Traffic Calming Red Lion Hill / Stamps Hill

BPC is in discussion with DCC officials to discuss traffic volumes, speed and unsuitable use of HGV's on Red Lion Hill and Stamps Hill. S106 funding from the Sherford development is available for this project. DCC have completed site audits & data analysis and external consultants are currently working on proposals which will then be the subject of a public consultation led by BPC

Community Speedwatch

Brixton Parish Council Community Emergency Plan was updated at the April meeting of BPC.

River Yealm Water Quality Working Group

This working group with the 7 Riparian Parish Councils in the River Yealm Catchment area together with other interested parties continues to meet to work with Environment Agency and South West Water to look at improving the quality of water in the River Yealm particularly relating to the discharge of sewage into the river at times of heavy rainfall. You can help by only flushing the 3 P's down the loo i.e. pee, poo and paper.

Land at Cofflete Creek

Brixton Parish Council has purchased the parcel of land at the head of Cofflete Creek on the site of the former Cofflete Mill.

The aim is to create a community amenity space for the residents of Brixton Parish, through careful consideration of the significant historic and environmental value of this piece of land to the community.

In the next few weeks the interpretation board and bench will likely be installed. In the autumn BPC will start to focus on the higher area.

Brixton Parish Environment Working Group

This group continues to meet monthly via zoom and the BPC Environment Policy has been updated and an action plan formulated. These can both be viewed on BPC website
