Results of South Hams District Council Elections

The results of the local elections at South Hams District Council have been declared.

The turnout across the District was 41.3 % of those eligible to cast their vote.

The Conservative Party remain the ruling party at the District Council, with a majority of one seat. The political composition of the Council will now be 16 Conservative, 10 Liberal Democrat, 3 Green and 2 Independent councillors.

There are 15 new councillors and 16 returning councillors.

Over the coming weeks, the newly formed Council will decide upon their new committees and also on their new Leader. Cllr John Tucker chose not to stand for re-election as Ward Member for West Dart, and also as Leader, a position he has held for 12 years.
